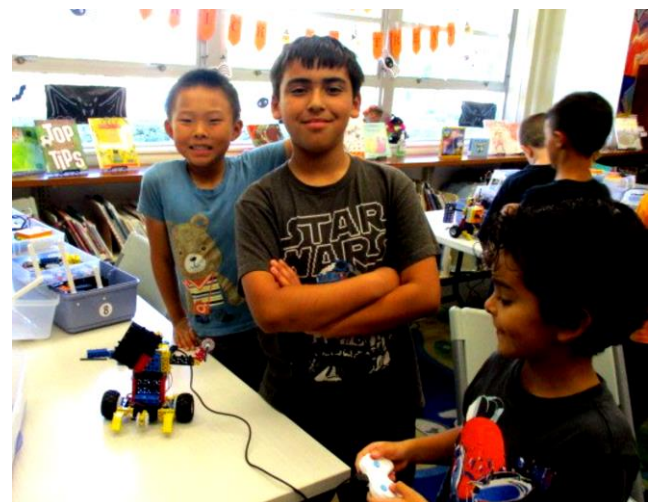

GRAND OPENING OF BORREGO SPRINGS LIBRARY



Two Board members had the opportunity to attend the Grand Opening of the new library in Borrego Springs. Construction for the new 14,000 square-foot library started in 2017 and was funded by the County, with generous local contributions from the Friends of the Borrego Springs Library and land donor Bill Wright. In addition, to the library's traditionally free services – the building will offer customers a variety of exciting amenities including:

- Free access to a network of 42 million books, DVDs, and CDs
- A large children's area, a space for teens and tweens
- Technology center with 3D printing capabilities
- Community room, Friends of the Library Book Nook and Conversation Café

A Walk of the Cosmos (a sidewalk that goes from the front of the Library out the back and over to the park with large medallion like plaques in the ground referencing various planets, etc.) joins the library, new Sheriff Station and a 16-acre park. As a dark sky community, there is a universe theme incorporated in the design of the library. Floor to ceiling windows bring in natural light and let patrons enjoy the spectacular views of the surrounding mountains.



The possibilities for what awaits the new library in Lakeside are exciting to imagine. We eagerly anticipate finding out soon in 2019.
