



Join us on Thursday, April 28th for our next Book Club meeting, where we will be discussing John Grisham's *A Time for Mercy*.





Set five years after the events of Grisham's first novel, 1989's *A Time to Kill*, and a couple of years after its sequel, 2013's *Sycamore Row*.*

DID YOU KNOW?

The new website has a Borrowing History feature so you can keep track of what you've read! Here is what you need to do:

1. Go to our website: www.sdcl.org
2. At the top right side of the web page, click on Log in/My SDCL
 - a. This will bring up a drop-down menu, click on Log In/Register



3. Type in your library card barcode, or username (if you have already created one)
4. Type in your 5 - 8 digit PIN and hit enter (or click on Log In)
 - a. Your PIN is often the last five digits of your phone number




- **Expanded Hours, beginning Monday April 11th!**

 - Sunday: Closed




- Click on your name at the top right and you will see a drop-down menu



- Under My Borrowing, click on Checked Out, this will take you to a page that lists all your borrowing options.
- Click on Borrowing History



- This will bring up a message that your borrowing history has not yet been enabled, and you can click a button to enable it



- Once you click on this, your borrowing history will show items after you return them. This will only show items from this point forward, it will not bring up items you have returned in the past.
- A gentle reminder from your friendly librarians not to mark inside books covers to keep track of what you've read. 😊





The Phlebotomist by Chris Panatier



Why?


Set in a post-apocalyptic, somewhat near future, our main protagonist Willa Wallace is doing her best to keep up her quota in a blood collection agency. Following a nuclear disaster, the surviving humans need constant blood transfusions, which brought about the Harvest that incentivizes people to donate blood for a profit. People in lower classes are those who have common blood types and need to donate as much as possible, concerning little for their health just to scrape by.

Willa is taking care of her grandson Isaiah who has a dangerous encounter with shadowy forces. This encourages Willa to look deeper into her role as a "Reaper" for the Harvest, which is the mandatory blood draw to which society has grown accustomed. The world order is just a façade as Willa stumbles on a large cover-up with the help of outsiders.

If you like dystopian fiction, sprinkled with conspiracy, and a healthy dose of action, this will scratch that itch.
